A LETTER FROM OUR CEO

When I first joined the fight in 2015, I was shocked to learn how little scientific progress had been made over the years toward the deadliest form of childhood brain cancer. But now, just 7 years later, we are finally seeing the type of breakthroughs necessary to change the future for families in the fight.

I'm so proud to lead this foundation, which has now become the largest source of private funding for DIPG research worldwide. Working together with our founding families, the Carrs and Mosiers, along with almost 40 ChadTough Defeat DIPG Family Partners, we've been able to fund 58 researchers across 31 institutions so far. Progress IS being made from the work we are supporting, and researchers are more optimistic than ever that a cure will be found in our lifetime. But with so little of government cancer research funding directed toward childhood brain cancer, researchers cannot be successful without funding from foundations like ours.

The ChadTough Defeat DIPG Scientific Advisory Council (SAC), comprised of leading DIPG experts, engages in a rigorous review of the research funding applications the foundation receives, to ensure the foundation uses its resources effectively to fund the most promising DIPG research.

FOUNDATION-FUNDED TRIALS ARE OFFERING FAMILIES THE GIFT OF TIME

DMG-ACT

For the third year in a row, the ChadTough Defeat DIPG Foundation announced its support for a first-of-its-kind trial platform called Diffuse Midline Glioma - Adaptive Combinatorial Therapy (DMG-ACT), bringing the total dollars committed to more than \$1.5 million. This promising project is a collaboration between the world's leading brain cancer experts, encompassing 30 research groups from 7 countries around the world.

By the end of 2022, 52 patients had been enrolled in the DMG-ACT, and researchers have investigated more than 100 drugs in the lab. A combination of 5 different drugs is now being vetted for addition to the trial.

One goal for ChadTough research grants is to provide funding for development of promising new ideas in the field of DIPG. With early support, researchers can gather the foundational data needed in order to procure larger

government funding. The grants provided by ChadTough for preliminary research

through DMG-ACT helped lead to an additional \$6.4 million in federal grants, thus magnifying the impact of the dollars we are investing in this critical work.

Ryder Knechtle lived more than 2 years after he was diagnosed with DIPG in July of 2020. His family believes the drug ONC201 allowed for extra time to make incredible permories.

Sophie lived nearly 24 months after she was diagnosed. Her family credits the drug ONC201 for allowing her to live more than a year past the average life expectancy for DIPG patients.

CAR T-CELL THERAPY

CAR T-cell therapy is a revolutionary process in cancer treatment that genetically alters a patient's own T-cells to attack cancer cells.

This trial has shown great promise and after decades could finally offer patients with DIPG a new treatment option for a disease that has historically proven resistant to other therapies. ChadTough has proudly funded more than \$1 million to the cutting-edge work at Stanford Medicine, and we look forward to following the progress in Dr. Monje's lab.


